ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENTS

Academic achievement has long been recognized as one of the important goals of education world over. It is important because it prepares students for future careers. Students’ achievement and growth are our major priorities and we are incessantly striving towards it. We are pleased to share the continued soaring achievements of our students. In 2018- All India Secondary School Examination (Class X), 41 students appeared and the result was cent per cent. The school toppers Pankaj Sharma, Devesh Khichar and Nikita Choudhary stood tall with 95.6%, 90.6% and 89.8% marks respectively. Besides being the School Topper, Pankaj Sharma made us proud by scoring 100 % in Social Science and Sanskrit and was awarded Certificate of Merit by CBSE. The first batch of Class XII will appear for Board Exam this year. For the remaining classes, the gap between the high and low achievers is being reduced slowly but steadily.

ENVIRONMENT EDUCATION

An effective Eco Club is actively working in the school. It undertakes plantation drives in the nearby areas independently and in association with different organizations. The habit of saving water and importance of rain water harvesting is also promoted amongst the students. The rain water is being harvested in the campus itself and the students get sensitized about the proper and judicious use of water. During the school’s annual exhibition, ‘Prabhat’ the students prepared models and projects of Bio Gas Plant and Rain Water Harvesting. During this exhibition old newspapers were used to prepare hangings for the display of information and for making the pointers too. Best out of waste was also displayed by the students in the form of planters being made of old plastic bottles, old CDs in to coasters and paper bags of newspapers. They are incessantly being made aware about conservation of resources, be it electricity, water or petroleum. They are encouraged to use means of mass transport. The students are also being trained to minimize waste and its management including electronic waste. The parents are also included in such awareness programmes and drives. Segregation of waste is done at school. Creation of a vermicompost pit is on the anvil. Students are also participating in Cleanliness drive in the school and adjoining areas.
